

DUNKERTON CITY COUNCIL met in special session, **October 19, 2018**, in the City Hall Council Chambers with Mayor Jessen presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Council members present: Mark Lichty, Bill Richard, Tina Dalton and DJ Manahl. Tom DeLong joined via conference call. Quorum present.

Moved by Manahl, seconded by Dalton to approve the agenda as written.

Public Works staff member Kuenstling provided the Council with a quote from Don's Truck Sales of Fairbank for installation of a wing plow. Quote included labor and parts to install a mid-mount wing, 2 V20 Gresen valve sections with cables, battery box and modification of the exhaust for \$6,295. Per staff member Kuenstling, Don's Truck Sales will try to work the installation of the plow into their schedule as soon as possible. The installation of the wing plow will take approximately a week to complete. Moved by DeLong, seconded by Lichty to approve installation of the wing plow by Don's Truck Sales of Fairbank for \$6,295. Ayes: Dalton, DeLong, Richard and Lichty. Nays: Manahl. Motion carried.

Mayor Jessen updated the Council regarding the pumps used for bypass during high water situations. Currently, the City has a diesel pump but the pump must be manned 24 hrs per day. Mayor Jessen stated there is electric power located near the bypass site and suggested using electrical bypass pumps to reduce the number of overtime hours. Star Equipment provided a quote for a Multiquip Submersible Centrifugal Pump, 2 hp, 230v, 1-phase 3" discharge, 170 gpm pump for \$1,216. Central Service & Supply provided a quote for an ABS Scavenger Submersible Sewage Pump, 5 hp, 230v, 1-phase 3" discharge, 324 gpm for \$5,993. In addition to the cost of the pumps, electrical wiring will need to be run. Cost of the wiring was unknown at this time. Moved by Manahl, seconded by DeLong to approve spending up to \$2,500 for a bypass pump with wiring installation. Ayes: Dalton, Lichty, Richard, DeLong and Manahl. Motion carried.

Public Works staff member Reynolds provided the Council with a repair quote for the street sweeper from MacQueen Equipment Group. MacQueen Equipment is the only vendor in Iowa that repairs Elgin street sweepers. Per staff member Reynolds, the street sweeper currently owned by the City is a \$250,000 unit. Items currently needing repair or replacement on the street sweeper are: water pump shaft, front hub and bearings, conveyor drive sprockets and chain, belt, parallel links, pins and bushings, dirt shoe and tow bars. Total cost for repairs is \$5,850. Moved by Dalton, seconded by Manahl to repair street sweeper as described not to exceed \$6,000. Ayes: DeLong, Lichty, Richard, Dalton, and Manahl. Motion carried.

Mark Eldridge from Thomas James updated the Council on the current changes in the recycling sector. Mr. Eldridge mentioned Republic Services is the only recycling vendor that will take all recyclables but that fee has increased to \$144/ton. Thomas James may change recycling to accept card board only. All other recyclables may go

to the landfill. Mr. Eldridge will provide additional information and options for the Council to consider at the November 12th regular council meeting.

Mr. Jim Parizek addressed the Council regarding a special permit that he will be seeking for his driveway. The Council did not discuss nor make a motion regarding Mr. Parizek's comments.

With no further discussion, Manahl / Lichty to adjourn at 8:12 pm.
